NOT ALL PLASTICS ARE CREATED EQUALLY























The true meaning of the recycle triangle

Did you know that the "numbered triangle" indicates the grade of plastic, how safe it is, and its ideal use? Although most plastics have the triangle, not all are created equally and are not easily recyclable.

The easiest plastics to recycle are #1 & #2. These are beverage, soap and detergent bottles.

Triangle 1 - PET or PETE. Usually found containing your favorite soft drink and as some food packaging. Beverage bottles eventually begin to break down after multiple uses allowing chemicals to seep into the liquids, which is why refilling these types of plastic containers isn't recommended. When these items are recycled correctly they are turned into fibers and polar fleece.

Triangle 2 - HDPE. A #2 inside the triangle indicates that it's high-density polyethylene or HDPE, often used for shampoo, laundry detergent, and household cleaner bottles. #2 plastics can be recycled into lumber, benches, drainage pipe, and other bottles and containers.

Triangle 3-5 & 7 are much more challenging to recycle.

Triangle 3 - Vinyl or PVC is used in flooring, pipes, and fittings and does not belong in the blue cart. These building materials are accepted in our Construction and Demolition (C&D) box rentals. The debris is processed through our dedicated C&D line, with 90% of the materials recovered and recycled. *Continued on back...*

Triangle 4 – LDPE. Low-density polyethylene, or LDPE, is found in shopping, frozen food, and bread bags. These items don't belong in your recycling cart. They should be taken to a local retailer. To recycle, visit www.plasticfilmrecycling.org.

Triangle 5 – Polypropylene or PP has a high melting point. Triangle 5 is on black plastic dinner trays and medicine bottles. This plastic is known to be relatively safe. Breaking it down to make resin can be somewhat difficult due to its durability to heat.

Triangle 6 – PS (Polystyrene) Avoid polystyrene, the lightweight, white spongy disposable foam used for drinking cups, take-out containers, packing peanuts, and more. There is no recycling market for these products; they must go into your trash container.

Triangle 7 – is a catch-all for the other plastics that don't fall within the 1-5 slots. For example, oven baking and other questionable plastics used for sunglasses, signs, and displays. Since the actual makeup isn't entirely known, these items are hard to recycle.

Make sure your items are clean, dry, empty and placed loosely in your recycle container. It helps our processing facility pick out the good recyclables!

FOOD WASTE RECYCLING PROGRAM ROLL-OUT:

We are working with our jurisdictions to prepare the SB 1383 Food Waste Recycling Program for our multifamily residents. The program will roll-out in phases: first to our commercial customers, then to our single-family residents.
