Household items containing corrosive, toxic, or flammable ingredients are considered Household Hazardous Waste (HHW). Do not pour these products down the drain or place them in your collection containers.

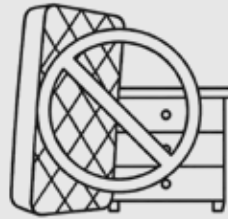

Bulky Items



Larger and bulkier items, including mattresses, box springs, and furniture, are **not allowed** in the collection carts or bins.

Please contact your property manager to schedule a special pickup for an additional fee or bring your items to our transfer station during normal business hours.

Our Recycling Center and Transfer Station (Contra Costa Waste Services) is located at **1300 Loveridge Road in Pittsburg**. The facility is **open daily to the public from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.** (closed Christmas and New Year's Day only).

We accept bulky items, furniture, solid waste, organics, wood, plastics, metals, cardboard, building materials, dirt, rock, concrete, electronics, appliances, and more.

Laws + Mandates

California Assembly Bill 341 (AB 341) aims to reduce the amount of reusable material sent to landfills and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

As of July 1, 2012, California requires all businesses that generate 4 or more cubic yards of garbage a week and multifamily dwellings with 5 units or more to recycle.

California Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383) is aimed at reducing greenhouse gas emissions, improving human health, and creating clean jobs that support a resilient local economy.

As of January 1, 2022, California requires all residents and businesses, including multifamily complexes with 5 units or more, to separate organic waste for composting or food recovery.

Organics



The organic material collected by our trucks is taken to a compost facility and turned into enriched soil.

ACCEPTED MATERIALS:

Meat • Fish • Poultry • Bones • Fruits • Vegetables • Grains
Plate Scrapings • Food-Soiled Paper • Leaves • Grass Clippings
Plant + Garden Trimmings • Weeds • Branches + Twigs (no more than 3-inch diameter and 3 feet long)



Dirt • Sod • Palm Fronds • Rock • Concrete
Pet Waste • BPI Certified Products
Bioplastics • Hazardous Materials

Recyclables



Please only place acceptable, clean, empty and dry items loosely in the recycling container.

ACCEPTED MATERIALS:

Plastics #1 PET + #2 HDPE • Bottles • Jars • Tin • Cans
Cereal + Snack Boxes • Cardboard • Clean Paper



Plastic containers #3-#5 + #7 are acceptable, but please reduce your consumption as these are challenging to recycle.



Food-Contaminated Containers • Plastic Film
Foam Products • Waxed Cardboard
E-Waste • Batteries • Hazardous Materials

Garbage



Bag items that are not reusable, recyclable, or compostable, and place them in the garbage container. Donate items in good condition.

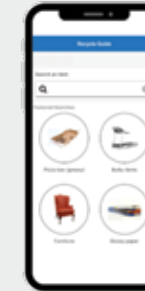

Helpful Tips

Donate or sell items that are still in good shape instead of throwing them away.

Appliances, E-waste + Bulky items are prohibited; see the resources on the rear panel for details.

Not sure if it's recyclable? Use the Recycle Resource Tool at mdrr.com/rrt.

Keep it clean. Place recyclables in the designated container empty, clean, and loose (no bags).

Collect food scraps in a reusable container, like a coffee can or plastic tube, before emptying the contents into the larger organics container.

Fight odors. Sprinkle a little baking soda in your indoor reusable container.



Flatten cardboard boxes to maximize space in the recycling container.
